4.4 Additional Features

- **Payroll Coverage:** Ensures that employees can continue to be paid during the disruption, preserving workforce stability and morale.
- **Temporary Relocation Expenses:** Covers the costs of moving operations to a temporary location, including rent, setup, and other associated expenses, allowing the company to maintain services.

6. Cyber Liability Insurance

- Other Related Incidents: Protection for any other cyber-related event that results in significant harm to the company's data systems, including malware infections or phishing attacks.

6.2 Limit of Liability

The maximum financial coverage provided for all claims under this policy, including any related damages, settlement costs, and legal fees. This limit is set to ensure that the Policyholder is protected from substantial financial loss in the event of a significant data breach or cyber event.

6.3 Deductible

The Policyholder is required to pay an initial deductible before the insurance coverage applies. This deductible helps manage minor claims while ensuring the policy is used for significant events.

6.4 Extended Coverage

In addition to covering the direct costs of the breach, this policy includes extended coverage for the following critical expenses:

- **Customer Notification:** Reimburses the costs incurred in notifying affected customers, employees, or other stakeholders in accordance with applicable data protection regulations.

6.5 Exclusions and Limitations

Certain exclusions may apply, such as claims related to negligence or failure to implement adequate cyber security measures, or losses from unreported breaches that occur outside the

policy's defined period. Additionally, this policy may exclude coverage for damages caused by intentional misconduct or fraud.

6.6 Benefits of Coverage

This cyber liability coverage provides essential protection for businesses in the digital age, offering:

- **Financial Security:** Protection against the significant costs associated with cyber incidents.
- **Compliance Support:** Assistance in meeting legal and regulatory requirements related to data breaches and customer notification.
- **Reputation Protection:** Helping mitigate the damage to the company's reputation by managing the breach and restoring trust with customers.

7. Professional Liability (Errors & Omissions)

- **7.1 Scope of Protection**. This coverage applies to claims arising from the company's professional services, including:
 - **Negligence:** Claims that the company failed to meet the expected standard of care while providing services, resulting in harm or loss to the client.
 - Errors or Omissions: Claims for mistakes or omissions made during the provision of services that lead to financial loss or damage for the client.
 - Failure to Perform Professional Duties: Coverage for situations where the company is alleged to have failed to perform services in accordance with agreed terms or industry standards.
- **7.2 Limit of Liability**. The maximum amount the insurer will pay for all claims under this coverage is limited to an amount. This limit applies to the total costs associated with each claim, including any damages awarded, settlements, and defense costs, and is intended to provide a cap on the insurer's financial responsibility.

7.3 Deductible.

The Policyholder is responsible for an initial deductible of an amount, which is the amount the company must pay out-of-pocket before the insurance coverage kicks in. This deductible applies to each individual claim and helps to manage smaller claims while ensuring the policy is used for more significant incidents.

7.4 Additional Features

- **Breach of Contract Claims:** This coverage extends to claims related to the company's failure to fulfill contractual obligations, including non-performance or incomplete service delivery, provided the breach arises from the company's professional duties.
- **Intellectual Property Infringement (If Applicable):** Protection for claims alleging that the company has unintentionally infringed upon the intellectual property rights of others, such as copyrights, trademarks, or patents, during the provision of professional services.

Exclusions and Limitations

- **Resolution:** Valid claims will be settled within provided timeframe after approval. Payment will be made directly to the Policyholder or designated beneficiary.
- **Dispute:** Any disagreements regarding claims settlement will follow the dispute resolution procedures outlined in Section 9.

10. Premium Payment Terms and Conditions

1. Premium Amount

The cost of maintaining this insurance policy will be provided, which reflects the coverage provided under the terms of the policy. The premium amount is determined based on factors such as the scope of coverage, risk assessments, and applicable discounts or surcharges.

2. Payment Schedule

Premium payments are due on a frequency basis. This flexible schedule allows the Policyholder to manage financial obligations conveniently while ensuring uninterrupted coverage.

3. Payment Method

Payments must be made to CESEL, which may include options such as:

- Online payments via the insurer's secure website or mobile app.
- Bank transfers or direct deposits.
- Mailing checks or money orders to the designated address.
- Automatic deductions from a linked account, if authorized.

Policyholders are encouraged to choose the method that best suits their needs and ensure timely submission of payments.

4. Late Payment Policy

To accommodate unforeseen delays, the policy includes a grace period of [specific timeframe, e.g., 15 days, 30 days] from the payment due date. During this period, the Policyholder retains full coverage under the policy. However, if payment is not received by the end of the grace period:

11. Policy Amendments and Renewal

- Amendments to this policy must be agreed upon in writing by both parties.
- Renewal notices will be issued timeframe before the policy's expiration.
- Renewal terms may include adjustments to premiums, deductibles, or coverage limits based on claims history and market conditions.

12. Termination

This policy may be terminated by:

- The Policyholder providing notice period written notice to the insurer.
- The insurer for non-payment of premiums, fraud, or material misrepresentation, with notice period written notice.
- Mutual agreement between the insurer and the Policyholder.

• Automatic termination upon the expiration date if not renewed.

13. Dispute Resolution

if any difference or dispute of any kind whatsoever shall arise between the Insured and the Company in respect of this policy, or in respect of any claim or liability arising or alleged to have risen hereunder or otherwise directly or indirectly, the same shall be referred to the decision of two Arbitrators, one to be chosen by the Insured and the other by the Company with the power to the said Arbitrators to appoint an Umpire. The cost of Arbitration shall be at the discretion of the Arbitrators or Umpire who shall also have the power to take evidence and compel production or exhibition of documents. The Awards under the Arbitration shall be final and binding upon the Parties. If the company shall disclaim liability to the Insured for any claim hereunder and such claim shall not within twelve calendar months from the date of such disclaimer have been referred to arbitration under the provisions herein contained then the claim shall for all purposes be deemed to have been abandoned and shall not thereafter be recoverable

14. Governing Law

This policy is governed by the laws of the Federal Republic of Nigeria. Any conflicting terms will be resolved in favor of compliance with local legal requirements.
