

# **CONFLICT OF INTEREST POLICY**

## Introduction

At CESEL, we recognize that conflicts of interest can compromise the integrity, objectivity, and reputation of the organization. This policy outlines our commitment to identifying, managing, and mitigating conflicts of interest to ensure that our business decisions are made in the best interests of the company and its stakeholders.

# **Definition of Conflict of Interest**

# **Policy Principles**
